Seed needs either a 30 day cold stratification or a one hour soak in 200 ppm GA3. Seeds can be covered but it is not necessary. Cuttings can be rooted under mist or with row cover and hand watering. A 1:10 dip in a liquid rooting hormone is suggested.

Collection Timing and Strategies

Cuttings should be taken from non-flowering stems and should be about two inches in length.

Cultural Information

Greenhouse conditions

Plants should be grown drier than traditional crops. Shearing will produce fuller plants for sales.

Garden conditions

Plants prefer full sun but can tolerate part shade, they also prefer a dry or well drained soil.
