Treatments (Suggested procedures)				
Cuttings root fairly easily. 2-3" cuttings with a few leaves at the apical end. I use a 1:10 liquid (wood's or dip n'grow). Stick cuttings in a very free draining mix. I use a 3:1 perlite to germinating mix combination. Put cuttings under intermittent mist until roots just begin to form then ween off of mist.				
Collection Timing and Strategies				
Cuttings can be taken any time plants are producing vegetative shoots. Softer cuttings taken in April/May from garden plants seem to root faster than plants harvested in July or later.				
Cultural Information				
Greenhouse conditions				
Grow plants in a fairly well draining mix and allow to dry between waterings. I have found that a weekly 100ppm N fertilizer keeps plants green and growing vigorously.				
Garden conditions				
This is a very versatile plant that tolerates a wide range of garden conditions. This is a great plant for the dry dappled shade parts of your garden.				
Other Expert Advice				
This plant was awarded the RHS award of garden merit from initial trials in 1976. It has proved to be largely pest and disease free.
