<b>Treatments</b> (Suggested procedures)				
Tip cuttings and internodal cuttings will root readily. You can use a 1:10 rooting hormone but is not always necessary. Rooting medium should be free draining. 3:1 perlite to peat is recommended for cuttings. Intermittent mist for the first week will help keep plants from wilting.				
<b>Collection Timing and Strategies</b>				
Cuttings can be take anytime that the plant is producing vegetative growth. Avoid flowering stems for cuttings, they will often hollow out and not root.				
<b>Cultural Information</b>				
<b>Greenhouse conditions</b>				
Grow on in a heated greenhouse. Until plants have finished do not allow to freeze. Once plants have finished, or after frost danger plants can be grown out side in irrigated beds.				
<b>Garden conditions</b>				
Plants are tolerant of a wide range of conditions, but perform best in fertile, well draining soils. Plants will also do best in full sun.				
<b>Other Expert Advice</b>				
Blooms from May to September. Will reach height of 18"-24", 15"-18" width. Grows in full sun to part shade with moderate to xeric moisture. Zones 4b-8 and up to 7,000 feet elevation.
