Treatments (Suggested procedures)				
Two-inch tip or internodal cuttings should be treated with a 1:10 liquid rooting hormone. Place under intermittent mist until root initiation occurs, usually within two weeks.				
Collection Timing and Strategies				
Cuttings can be harvested any time plant is actively growing. Remove inflorescence from cutting material.				
Cultural Information				
Greenhouse conditions				
Very easy to grow under a wide range of environmental conditions. Shearing will create a fuller plant with more vegetative shoots for cuttings.				
Garden conditions				
Best if grown in full sun with protection from winter wind. Plant develops a woody base and is more attractive if pruned to encourage vegetative growth.
