<b>Treatments</b> (Suggested procedures)				
<p>3" tip cuttings will begin to root in 7-10 days. Cuttings should be processed so that there is at least one node below the media. Rooting compounds aid in more uniform rooting. A free-draining cutting media such as 3perlite:1peat is suggested to keep the basal ends from staying too wet and rotting. Frequent misting and high humidity is important for the first 3-4 days to keep the plants from wilting until they have hardened off. Misting and high humidity should be eliminated by the time plants are forming roots.</p>				
<b>Collection Timing and Strategies</b>				
Cuttings can be taken from any vegetative tip growth. Avoid stems that have already formed inflorescences.				
<b>Cultural Information</b>				
<b>Greenhouse conditions</b>				
In the greenhouse keep plants spaced to provide optimal airflow. Plants can be sheared/pinched to provide a fuller plant.				
<b>Garden conditions</b>				
Plants will grow in many different garden conditions. Preferred sites have full sun and some supplemental irrigation. Deadheading or cutting plants back after the initial flush of flowers will give a second round of cutting material and/or can give a second flush of blooms.				
<b>Other Expert Advice</b>				
Don't eat the flowers! They made my lips feel like they were on fire and my throat swell shut.
