Softwood cuttings under mist		Northern China		
<b>Treatments</b> (Suggested procedures)				
<p>Take softwood cuttings in June or July while the shrubs is actively growing before the terminal bud has hardened. As this species has opposite leaf arraignment, The cutting ideally should have 3 sets of leaves and a meristematic terminal. Leave the terminal unless it is a flower bud, then remove it. Cut the bottom 1/4" below the node and strip off the lower set of leaves. Dip the end in 1000ppm of IBA or alternatively spray over the top with a water soluble IBA also mixed to 1000ppm concentration. Fill trays with a well drained rooting media. Scott Skogerboe at Fort Collins Wholesale Nursery uses 3 parts perlite to 1 part peat. Stick the cuttings into the rooting media and place the tray of cuttings under intermittant mist until rooted, which takes about a month.</p>

This is a wonderful dwarf shrub, perfect as a foundation planting as it slowly grows to only 3 to 5 feet. It is also fairly drought tolerant and adaptable to many of the garden soils found commonly in the plains and mountain states.

Currently being propagated by Fort Collins Wholesale Nursery and availability should not be a problem. Van Essen possibly also wants to start propagating.
