Treatments (Suggested procedures)

Float to remove any hollow seeds. Give at least 30 days cold moist stratification or sow in outdoor seedbeds in the fall.

Collection Timing and Strategies

Seeds are borne in a tennis ball sized three chambered fruit. The seed inside the pod are the size of small grapes and are black. Seed matures in late July.

Cultural Information

Greenhouse conditions

Use a well drained media and be cautious of over watering. Too much fertilizer can make for weak leggy plants. Indoors peach mealybug can be a problem

Garden conditions

Plant in full sun and in a well drained soil. Very tolerant of alkaline soils.

Other Expert Advice

Grows in full sun to part shade with xeric moisture. Can reach height of 20'. Flowers appear in May. Grows best in zones 4-9. Quite cold-hardy and prefers rich warm loam.
